Virtual inter-school competitions were organised through the partnership, and Partnership staff gathered and collated data to award competition certificates and places across the Partnership.</p> <p>Our aim is for all children (2-11) to participate in at least one inter-school competition. For Nursery and KS1, this will be organised for 21/22 amongst local schools independently of the Sports</p>

			<p>Partnership.</p> <p>Target groups - children identified as low or non-participants in any extra-curricular sports activity all used a pedometer once weekly to track their progress and fitness levels.</p> <p>Across each of three terms, groups of 10 children in KS2 demonstrating low levels of self-confidence and esteem (resulting from Covid measures and lockdown recovery) took part in 'Active play through stories' breaktime sessions once weekly.</p>

Refresh equipment for playtimes and facilitate use of the field into winter months - shoe racks for outdoor footwear.	£1500	Ensure children have space to play in colder months by allowing use of field. Organise storage for footwear.	Shoe racks for outdoor footwear for all classes allowed increased access to outdoor field and play environment space to enable social distancing and discrete play zones.
